should take your role seriously and that this is the most important thing of all.



They were also able to find the town flower "Sasayuri" in bloom, providing a good opportunity to learn about the nature of the local Anamizu area.

On Friday, June 16, we divided the group into four groups for a walk in the Morohashi, Nakai, Anamizu and Anamizu district. The participants were guided and briefed by satonavi and members of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

He spoke about the time when there were crested ibis in Noto, the breeding efforts of the last crested ibis, "Nori," and the crested ibis fan club, which currently has 545 crested ibis on Sado Island and is working to get them flying again in Noto's sky. We were able to feel his "ibis love" through his lecture.
