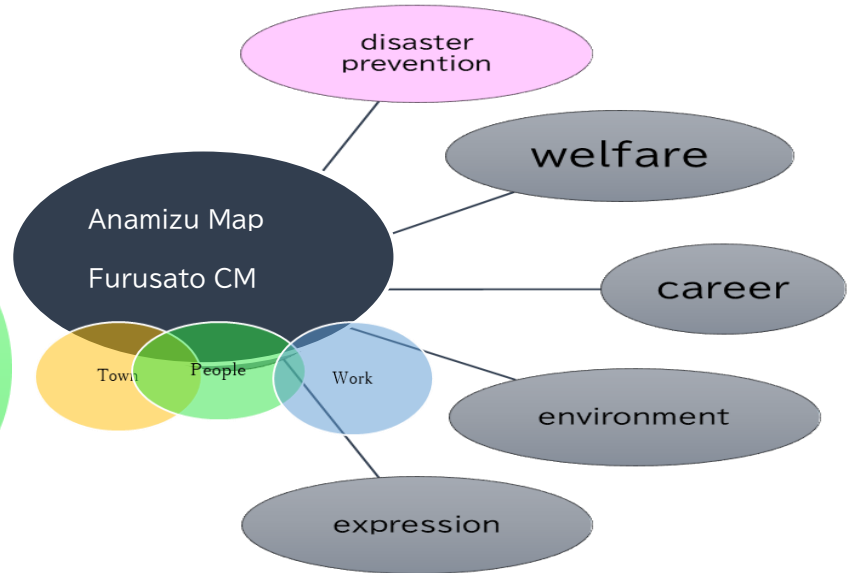




Learning how to live with "Town, People and Work"

What perspectives do you bring to the study?



In this year's integrated study period, we will consider the reconstruction of Anamizu from the perspective of junior high school students in terms of "town," "people" and "work". I believe that thinking about the future of this town will lead to introspection about one's own way of life.

When we think about the future of a town, we tend to focus on facilities and events that attract people. This year, therefore, we have decided to think from the five perspectives of "disaster prevention," "welfare," "career," "environment," and "expression".

Disaster prevention is an important point for those of us who have been affected by the disaster to think about what we need to do in the future. "Welfare" will cover a wide range of people, from small children to the elderly. "Career" is a subject that is related to career paths and occupations in order to think about one's own way of life. "Environment" is an indispensable perspective for thinking about Anamizu, which is surrounded by the sea and mountains. I would imagine many students find "Expression" especially difficult.

Adults are thinking about the reconstruction of the town from an adult's perspective. I encourage Junior high school students to think about the "future of Anamizu Town" from their own unique perspective. We hope that you will come up with a plan that will surprise the adults and make us say, "I never would have thought of that."
