On the first day, you will go to Osaka.



Dotonbori is one of the most popular tourist destinations in Osaka.

It is the best place in Osaka to experience food culture.

This area is also known as the entertainment district.

You can eat Takoyaki and Okonomiyaki.

These are Osaka's famous products.

Takoyaki is a small, ball-shaped pancake with diced octopus and other ingredients in the center.

Okonomiyaki is a thin and flat pancake fried on a hot plate with bits of meat, vegetables, and seafood.



Next, you will go to Osaka castle.

Osaka Castle was originally built in 1583 by military commander Hideyoshi Toyotomi.

Hideyoshi made his way in the world from a low position and ruled over the whole country.

But the original castle doesn't exist anymore.

The current Osaka Castle is third generation.

Today, there is a history museum inside displaying historical materials about the castle and the great commander Hideyoshi.

On the second day, you will go to Kyoto and visit Fushimi Inari Taisha.

Fushimi Inari Taisha

There are more than 30,000 shrines in Japan dedicated to the god Inari. Fushimi Inari Taisha is the head shrine.

The numerous red Torii gates are the icons of this shrine.

This is a spiritual place.

Kiyomizudera temple



After this, you will go to Kiyomizu-dera Temple.

Kiyomizu-dera Temple was originally built in 798 and rebuilt in 1633.

Kiyomizu-dera Temple is famous for its cherry blossoms.

So you can see cherry blossoms and you can enjoy the breathtaking view of Kyoto from the veranda.

On the third day, you will go to Ishikawa.



Kenrokuen is one of the Japan's three most celebrated gardens.

It is famous for beautiful Japanese gardens.

You can see cherry blossoms and plum blossoms.

Our next stop will be the Higashi-chaya district.

Higashi-chaya district is the most famous tourist site in Ishikawa.

It is well known for its historic architecture and streets.

You can eat gold leaf ice cream here.

On the fourth day, you will go to Tokyo.



Akihabara is known as the “Center of Japanese Otaku culture.”

There are many anime and manga shops.

You can buy anime goods here.

Sensoji is the oldest temple in Tokyo.

The main gate of the temple is called Kaminari Mon or Thunder Gate.

It has a large red paper lantern and two statues in it.

There is a long shopping street between the gate and the temple.


The street is called Nakamise Dori.
